Application instructions for a Summer Visiting Student

All completed applications for admission as a visiting student are reviewed by the Assistant Dean of Admissions and the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs. A completed application consists of:

1. A complete, electronically certified application;
2. A brief supplemental statement setting forth the reasons for visiting;
3. A certified transcript from your current law school;
4. Written permission to attend Roger Williams University School of Law from your current law school; and
5. A \$60 application fee, payable directly to RWU Law.

Character and Fitness Advisory

Be sure all necessary and pertinent facts and information have been disclosed on your application. Inconsistencies discovered after you matriculate could subject you to dismissal from the School of Law. Questions asked on the application are also asked by bar examiners. Some jurisdictions compare these answers against those on law school applications. Any discrepancies may adversely affect your admission to the bar. Of particular importance are juvenile or minor matters in which the court has sealed the records. Many bar examiners take the position that the records are not sealed for purposes of admission to the bar. A student must communicate any material change in admissions information occurring prior to matriculation or during enrollment as a student to the Office of Admissions.

Before applying for admission to law school, you are advised to thoroughly investigate the requirements for admission to the bar in the states or jurisdictions in which you intend to practice law upon graduation and, if prudent, consult with the relevant bar admitting authorities. Applicants who have been arrested, charged with,

or convicted of a crime should carefully review the requirements for admission to practice in the state or states in which they intend to practice as their right to admission may be limited. Applicants who have been committed to a psychiatric treatment facility or who have experienced serious difficulties meeting their financial responsibilities should also review the requirement for practice.
