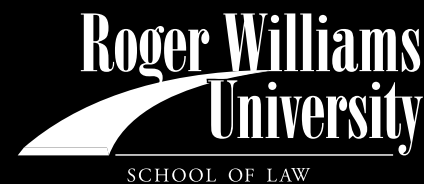

**To enroll in either the London or Lisbon summer programs:**

1. Complete and mail the Registration Form with a brief personal statement (no more than 250 words) to: International Programs, Roger Williams University School of Law, Ten Metacom Avenue, Bristol, RI 02809-5171. The personal statement must highlight (a.) what you can contribute to the program(s) and (b.) how you expect the program(s) will contribute to your career. Students from schools other than Roger Williams School of Law must arrange to have the law school dean or registrar directly submit a letter of good standing to the same address.
2. Enclose a \$250 registration fee. This sum is applied to tuition, if admitted, or is refunded if enrollment is denied. Upon notification of admission, the registration fee will be forfeited if the applicant fails to attend for any reason.
3. If you are admitted to either the London or Lisbon programs, you will receive a packet of information outlining program details, such as passports, travel, texts, meals, and clothing.
4. The expected enrollment in each of the programs offered is between twenty and thirty students.
5. **Application deadline, March 7, 2008. Tuition and fees due April 18, 2008.** No refund of tuition and fees will be given to students who withdraw from the program. Admitted students must provide proof of applicable health insurance coverage along with payment of the tuition and fees or they will be charged a nominal fee for university health insurance.

Actual award of academic credit is subject to determination by each student's home school. Credit earned in foreign summer study generally is not usable to accelerate graduation at U.S. law schools.

**CANCELLATION OF PROGRAMS:** The Roger Williams University School of Law reserves the right to cancel either or both programs described in this prospectus for insufficient enrollment or for any other reason. Should it prove necessary to do so, the school will promptly notify all registrants and refund all tuition and fees paid. The termination and cancellation policies that apply in the event of safety or security risks arising during a program are posted at <http://law.rwu.edu> and will be mailed to all accepted applicants.

**PLEASE NOTE:** Tuition and fees for the London Program include tuition, housing, breakfast, required course materials, and special events. Tuition and fees for the Lisbon Program include tuition, housing, breakfast, weekday lunch at Catholic University of Portugal, some course materials, and special events. Some course materials for the Lisbon Program must be purchased by the student. Airfare, other transportation costs, and personal spending money are in addition to the above fees. We make all possible effort to accommodate double occupancy requests in Lisbon, but cannot guarantee success. Preference is given to pairs of admitted students who apply to share a room.
