ASSIGNMENT FOR FIRST CLASS AUGUST 18 (and through August 30)

I am looking forward to meeting you on August 18th and working together for the semester. We will spend the first few weeks on introductory material, background on the federal courts and the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, how precedent is created, and looking at the Complaint (initial filing) of a current lawsuit, **State of Missouri v China**, concerning potential liability for covid-19.

There are three **required** "texts" for this class: (1) the casebook for the course Marcus, Redish, Sherman & Pfander Civil Procedure (Seventh Edition); (2) a separate Federal Rules (West Ed. **2021**); and (3) Click and Learn Civil Procedure by Upchurch, Gilles & Ho (electronic). C&L is an online study aid with formative assessments that we will use both semesters and will help you learn about civil procedure. The C&L can be purchased from Carolina Press which has given us a very special price for the year (for \$19.95 instead of \$34.95).

- 5. You will be able to start using CL:CP immediately.
